## Heritage Open Days Walks in Bromley

### 17<sup>th</sup>C Bromley and Sheppard's Colleges

*Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> September*

*Meet 10:30am outside the Railway Tavern  
opp. Bromley North station*

The 17<sup>th</sup> century Grade 1 listed, Wren inspired buildings form a quiet oasis in Bromley North. The walk will take us through the two quadrangles of the main College, into the Chapel (1862), around the grounds to see Sheppard's College (1840) and some 200 year old graffiti.



### Bromley Palace and Park

The 18<sup>th</sup> century Georgian home of the Bishops of Rochester was transformed in 1845 by Victorian entrepreneur Coles-Child. We will see the grand staircase, wood carved panels, an Adams fireplace and more; also historic landscape features in the adjoining park.



### Victorian Bromley (Arts and Crafts, HG Wells)

*Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> September*

*Meet 10:30am main entrance of Primark, Market Square*

A walk around the old town of Bromley to get a flavour of its Victorian heyday, when many buildings in the Arts and Crafts style were built and the young Herbert George Wells was experiencing life that would later shape his novels.
